Admin Arrangements

Marion had reported back already on the most recent Area Forum no others have been held.

Flu Clinics

There has been a huge uptake of the flu vaccines. Flu clinics have been held for the over 65's on Saturday 26th September at Woodley and on 3rd October at Green Road. 300 patients were vaccinated at each site on these days.

Vaccines for 100 housebound patients have been reserved and patients attending the surgery for treatment such as dressing changes will be offered the vaccine to save them attending the surgery for a separate vaccine clinic.

50 doses are to be administered at Mulberry House Care Home by Dr Brock and a nurse. The under 65's with health issues are also being vaccinated but this is a different vaccine to the over 65's one. These clinics are very popular and are being filled within half an hour of appearing on the Web Site. The clinics are dependent on the arrival of the vaccine so a long lead time to book appointments is not possible. Patients will have to keep looking on the Web Site. The vaccine will be made available for the 50 - 64 age group after November. This would be

Sheena said that the take up of vaccine at the pharmacy in Twyford was much more than in previous years. Usually they have 2,000 to date but this year it has been 25,000.

another 6000 patients to be vaccinated at Parkside.
